

# Call: Join the thematic group Open Science Policy

WANT TO HELP SHAPE THE FUTURE OF OPEN SCIENCE IN FLANDERS? JOIN THE THEMATIC GROUP OPEN SCIENCE POLICY AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE TOGETHER WITH OTHER NETWORK PARTNERS.

The **Flemish Open Science Policy Plan**<sup>1</sup> aims to embed Open Science-by-design as a natural part of the research process, following the principle "as open as possible, as closed as necessary". By 2030, researchers in Flanders should be able to handle Open Science principles smoothly, without additional administrative burdens. The policy plan translates this mission and vision into seven strategic objectives, further elaborated in operational objectives and concrete policy actions. To achieve these objectives, the Flemish knowledge institutions join forces via the **Flemish Research Data Network (FRDN)**, a network organisation stimulating knowledge sharing, collaboration and professionalisation.

The **thematic groups** bring together subject-matter experts from the network partners around a specific theme within the policy plan. From the institutions, at least every division is represented in the thematic groups. The members of the thematic group work together on shared questions and exchange insights directly related to that theme. They develop a shared vision on the theme and elaborate it further. They operate within the framework set out in the policy plan, while leaving the necessary room for innovation. In addition, together with the Coordination Hub, they advise and support the project groups linked to that theme.

Each thematic group consists of a chair and a team of subject-matter experts from the various network partners. From the institutions, **at least every division is represented**.

We aim for the most balanced composition possible across institutions and divisions:

The **thematic group Open Science Policy** focuses on the policy development and implementation of the Flemish Open Science policy and provides advice where needed on various Open Science topics such as FAIR data, Open Access publications, monitoring, and recognition and rewards. The thematic group also keeps track of policy developments at national and European level, so that these can be responded to in a timely manner and strategic objectives can be re-evaluated where necessary.
